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Why?

Public policies shape the environment in which individuals and organizations function and interact, making them important to any initiative seeking to advance sustainable development.

Many agrifood development projects and programs aim to support positive policy changes by organizing policy dialogues. Yet, despite their importance, there is little guidance available to date on how to effectively organize policy dialogues that are inclusive of diverse stakeholders in the context of agrifood systems.


Ideally, policy dialogues and other processes seeking to influence policies should aim to promote innovation through smart, inclusive and collaboratively developed and implemented policies.
